## LEGION MEMBERSHIP

I wanted to thank all the members that have sent in there 2018 Dues so far. Your support helps keep us a strong voice on Capitol Hill to address Veterans issues and to keep the VA doing the right things for our Veterans. Just a reminder, our Membership Year starts on July 1<sup>st.</sup> 2017. All members should have their Dues paid no later than February 1<sup>s.t.</sup> 2018.

Article X, Section 7 of our Bylaws States:

A member whose dues for the current year that have not been paid on or before January 1st. shall be classified as delinquent. If His or Her dues are paid on or before February 1<sup>st</sup>. they will be automatically reinstated. If any member is still delinquent after February 1st. Membership shall be suspended from all privileges. If a member is still under such suspension on June 30<sup>th</sup>. Of such year, their Membership in The American Legion shall be forfeited. A member so suspended or whose membership has been forfeited may be reinstated to active membership in good standing by vote of the post and payment of current dues for the year in which reinstatement occurs. Provided, however, that The National Department may wave the provisions hereof, upon payment of dues for the year in which reinstatement occurs, with reference to former members who have been prevented from paving dues due to Active Military Ser-

# WHY YOU NEED TO THINK LIKE A CFO

In the corporate environment, you can leave financials to someone else, but not in the non-profit world. Everyone from the Commander to the Trustees to the Executive Team down to each individual member needs to think like a Chief Financial Officer. Our Post lives or dies based on cash flow, so the more we can fine tune our activities the better our cash flow.

And while the Commander and the rest of the leadership of the Post are focusing on sustainable growth all members can help to maintain a positive cash flow.

# So what is Cash Flow?

Cash flow is the money that is moving in and out of the Post each month. Although it does seem sometimes that cash flow only goes one way- out- it does flow both ways.

### Cash In:

Cash is coming in from the bar, the hall and from pull-tabs and donations from the Auxiliary, Riders and SAL and a cluster of people and organizations who are benevolent to our mission.

### Cash Out:

Cash that is going out of the Post in the form of payment for expenses, like the mortgage, utilities, upkeep and upgrades.

Think of cash flow as a picture of your own checking account. If

more money is coming in that is going out, you are in a positive cash flow position and you will have enough to pay your bills. If more cash is going out than coming in, you are in danger of being overdrawn.

# So why is cash flow so important?

The SBA (Small Business Administration) says that inadequate cash reserves are the top reason that most businesses fail. While the budget is our guide we need to manage the cash flow and ensure that each month it remains positive.

## How can you help?

The fastest way for our Post to become financially secure and self-sustaining is for everyone to help find creative ways to fund activities and to promote our Hall to the non-member public. Did you know that the Hall is available during the week for business meetings and seminars? Our goal should be to have the Hall rented every weekend and only by spreading the word to your friends and family can we hope to fulfill this mission.

There are many ways that you as a member can help maintain positive cash flow. One fun way is to attend the many functions that your Post has to offer like the New Year's Party or the St. Patties Day party. Other ways are a bit more subtle like reducing the cost of maintenance by picking up debris that you may notice in places like the parking lot or the head. Being careful not to damage the property of the post and volunteering for projects that will save the Post labor expenses. Each of one of our membership has a responsibility to support your Post so that we can continue to do the good work for our veterans and the community we live in. Without the Post many would suffer.

# Now about the finances!

We are cautiously optimistic. Our budget is due for a midyear review in January and if need-be we will adjust the budget at that time to reflect our current position. After the budget review, priorities will be set for the many upgrade projects and general maintenance expenses that have been identified and need to be addressed.

We are still in the hunt for a bank who will give us a long term mortgage at a reasonable rate. We have targeted the end of January to choose the winning bank.

Remember to keep thinking like a CFO!

To form another branch of government, at the Cabinet level, is just creating more bureaucracy and patronage. This is something we do not need!

- 1. Sam Houston served under Gen. Jackson in the War of 1812. was governor of Tennessee in 1827, after which he became a full -fledged member of the Cherokee Indian tribe. He joined in the war for Texan independence and became commander-in-chief in the army and President of the Republic of Texas until it was admitted as a State into the Union. He then served as U.S. Senator from Texas, from 1846 to 1859, when he was chosen Governor, serving until March 1861, when he was deposed because he refused to swear allegiance to the Confederacy.
- 2. Gen. James A. Garfield used the words "God reigns, and the government in Washington still lives," during an informal mass meeting in front of the Merchants Exchange, New York City, April 15, 1865, the day of President Lincoln's death.
- 3. When a sizable section of Oklahoma known locally as "the Cherokee strip" was thrown open for white settlement in 1893 by what Is known as "The Run", Federal soldiers cleared this territorywhich comprises about one-fifth of the present State-of all inhabitants and then posted a guard about the borders. At noon on September 16th the strip was declared open, and about 150,000 people on horseback, foot, and in every form of conveyance dashed from the four borders into the Strip and staked their claims. Naturally a few people had eluded the vigilance of the troops and were hidden within the Strip, they simply emerged from hiding and picked out the best claims, they were

called "sooners" and when discovered were shot without the formality of a trial.

- 4. Edward Everett, of Massachusetts, delivered the "Oration of the Day" at the dedication of the Gettysburg field on November 19, 1863, when Lincoln gave his immortal address, his speech lasted more than an hour. Lincoln's lasted about three minutes.
- 5. The order, "If anyone attempts to haul down the American Flag, shoot him on the spot" was given by John A. Dix, Acting Secretary of the Treasury, in a dispatch to the internal revenue office at New Orleans, January 29, 1861.
